THE BICENTENNIAL CELEBRATION
1792 - 1992

The International Polonaise Ball was announced for 7:30 but already much earlier the cocktail lounge started to fill with beautiful ladies in flowing gowns and gentlemen attired in black and white tie or uniforms with all their military decorations.

The double line of cadets of the U.S. Air Force, ROTC, Det. 155 of University of Miami, in full regalia and with American and Polish flags, greeted all the guests at the entrance.

The receiving line led by Lady Blanka Rosenstiel included many of the ladies of the committee — there was a feeling of great anticipation in the air....

The cocktail party, courtesy of Mrs. Pauline Kostiuk, Mr. Waldemar Dowiak and Mr. P. Bordeaux of the Sazerac Co. of New Orleans, was mostly spent on a joyous reunion of the many who came from near and from far to be at this very special occasion.

The state was set for two important celebrations: the 20th anniversary of the American Institute of Polish Culture, but mostly and especially, for the Bicentennial Celebration of the most prestigious of Polish Orders, the Virtuti Militari Cross. The Order was established by King August Poniatowski in 1792 and was given, for bravery on the battlefield, to more than 20,000 persons of various nationalities worldwide.

The ballroom decor, partially underwritten by Sir Edward and Lady Anna Lee Porter, looked elegant and airy; the Polish white eagle with a golden crown,

sported for the occasion a large Virtuti Militari Cross (perfect replica made by Mrs. Domanska of Key Biscayne); the table arrangements, donated by Mr. and Mrs. Roman Cooper of Chicago included high candelabras and hundreds of pink roses cascading from tall mirrored vases forming an umbrella over seated guests.

The ceiling, decorated with hundreds of small lightstrings in long chiffon garlands with pink balls of ostrich feathers, seemed to pull the large ballroom together making it cozy and friendly.

After the brief ceremony of presentation of colors by the cadets and the singing of the national anthems, the message from President George Bush was read. Prof. Zdzislaw Wesolowski was in charge of this brief presentation program. He introduced the Vice Minister of National Defense Mr. Janusz Onyszkiewicz who together with his beautiful wife Joanna, came from Poland for this occasion. Mr. Onyszkiewicz read a special message from the president of Poland, Lech Walesa. All recipients of the Virtuti Militari Cross were introduced afterwards together with some members of their families. Lady Blanka presented roses

A delicious dinner was served, salmon in dill sauce, filet mignon and a dessert consisting of a chocolate basket filled with berries in sabayone cream. Polish vodka "Luksusowa", donated by Adamba Imports Corp. of New York, flowed freely as did the champagne donated by Mrs. Harriet Irsay and Mr. and Mrs. Stanley Musial. Special gourmandise was passed in bonbonieres with the finest of Wawel chocolates from Poland generously offered also by Adamba Imports Corp.

Following dessert, distinguished guests were introduced: Mr. Nicholas Koni, a renowned sculptor of Palm Beach, who donated a monumental sculpture of Marshal Jozef Pilsudski to the new democratic Poland, was applauded loudly for his magnanimous gesture (the sculpture already in Poland will be officially unveiled this year, in May); the beautiful actress of the "M.A.S.H." fame, Ms. Loretta Swit, who came especially to our ball from London and Mr. Wieslaw Kuniczak, the prominent Polish writer, who received the Institute's 1992 AIPC Gold Medal Award for his outstanding accomplishment in the field of literature.

When Lady Blanka invited all the Board Members to thank them sincerely for their full cooperation, assistance

and day to day work at the Institute and to the cutting of the 20th Anniversary cake, all present stood up and sang "Sto lat, sto lat" (Polish birthday song).

The door prizes chaired by Pauline Kostuik included many valuable items, amongst these, a beautiful painting by Gilbert Kieffer, a French painter, married to the very charming Anetka Wochajewska-Kieffer of Poland — they both came from the Isle de la Reunion for his paintings exhibition at the Lumbreras Fine Art Gallery in Miami.

It was a night to remember. The ball ended very late with a Grand Polonaise danced by all to the accompaniment of the Michael Longo orchestra, courtesy of Mrs. Harriet Irsay.






